

Notes on the slide sets

The slide sets are pre-loaded on the USB stick that comes with this pack. The entire pack and the slide sets are available for download from the Tackling HIV Testing section of the MedFASH website, www.medfash.org.uk, and all materials may be freely reproduced for the purpose of ensuring quality of care.

Important information about the case studies

The cases have been contributed by leading specialists in their fields and are all composites of patients they have seen. Care has been taken to anonymise the cases to ensure that patients cannot be identified. Contributors are not identified in the individual cases to remove the possibility of identification by location, but all those who contributed are listed in the acknowledgements section at the back of this pack. Any resemblance to persons living or dead is therefore entirely coincidental and no inference should be made about the HIV status of any individual, living or dead, from the case studies.

Creating a presentation

The slide sets can be combined and adapted to create presentations of varying length, emphasis and content. Here are some suggestions for how to do this.

Step 1: introduction

Decide on the emphasis of your presentation. There are three slide sets named A to C designed to introduce the subject of routine HIV testing in non-HIV specialist healthcare settings. You might use any or all of them as they stand, or select slides from several to create a customised introduction. Slide set B in particular provides referenced statistical evidence which is referred to in the Key Messages slides in Set D.

Step 2: case studies

Select one or more of the case studies that illustrate the particular points you want to make. See the grid for more information about which specialty areas each case study relates to. If you have time, add a case study from your own experience to add local flavour using those in the pack as a template. Where possible, add in clinical

pictures of your own if you have them, or obtain some from the website listed at Section 8.

Step 3: learning points and key messages

Slide set D contains sections of the HIV testing guidelines, maps of UK HIV prevalence, maps of countries with high HIV prevalence and ready-prepared learning points and key messages. Please note that the statistics mentioned in the Key Messages are referenced in the introduction slide set B.

Step 4: the end

Please include the following slides in any presentation created from these materials:

- the *Tackling HIV Testing* Project Advisory Group slide
- the *HIV for non-HIV specialists* booklet slide.

Notes. There are explanatory notes under many of the question and summary slides. The abstracts for any research cited are provided for your convenience. Please be sure to check the notes page view to ensure you locate all the relevant information.

Highlighting key points. The red and blue circles on extracts from the *UK national guidelines for HIV testing 2008* are 'grouped' with the images to prevent them being accidentally dislodged. Also, they are often ordered in layers. Both these settings can be accessed by right-clicking on the object and using the menu that appears.

Slide masters. The *Tackling HIV Testing: increasing detection and diagnosis* project has been branded by MedFASH, but you can also insert a logo from your own organisation to personalise the presentation.
