

Council motion on HIV testing

The Halve It campaign on HIV testing is a coalition of national experts determined to tackle the continued public health challenges posed by HIV. Our aims are to halve the proportion of people diagnosed late and living with undiagnosed HIV, through the scaling up of HIV testing services in line with national guidance and through the implementation of the Public Health Outcomes Framework.

Halve It comprises 21 HIV charities, patient groups, clinician groups and industry, and our observer members include the Local Government Association, Department of Health, Public Health England and the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence. The campaign has the support of the Leader of the Opposition, the Deputy Prime Minister and the Prime Minister, in addition to many Councillors, MPs and Peers across the country.

The recent health reforms have led to a change in the commissioning and delivery of HIV services. Having worked over the last five years to secure the production of national guidance on HIV testing (see appendices), the Halve It coalition is keen to ensure that the recommendations within these guidelines are robustly implemented at a local level, with the strong support of local government. To this end, we have worked with councillor colleagues to draft a council motion on HIV testing, which we hope to pass in all 64 local authorities with high HIV prevalence (>2 per 1000 residents) in the run up to World AIDS Day this year – **Monday 1 December 2014**.

Draft motion on HIV testing

That [name] council,

- i. Recognises the importance of local action in coordinating and commissioning accessible and effective HIV testing to reach the undiagnosed and reduce late HIV diagnosis,
- ii. Recognises that [local authority area] has a high prevalence of HIV (over 2 diagnosed per 1,000 residents) and commits to strengthening its own provision of HIV testing services through working with local NHS partners, HIV charities and patient groups.
- iii. Recognises that late HIV diagnosis is a Public Health Outcomes Indicator in the Public Health Outcomes Framework
- iv. Recognises the volume and quality of public health and local government guidelines and performance indicators designed to support local authority implementation and monitoring of appropriate and effective testing guidelines

The council further notes,

- i. That an estimated 100,000 people were living in England with HIV in 2012; 22% were unaware of their status
- ii. That there is an impact of late diagnosis on individual health, public health and health budgets. Late diagnosis increases the likelihood of the need for complex and expensive treatment and the risk of onward transmission to others. 47% of people diagnosed with HIV in 2012 were diagnosed late (with a CD4 count <350mm³)
- iii. That if diagnosed early, put on a clear treatment pathway and guaranteed access to antiretroviral therapy (ART), people living with HIV can expect to have a near-normal life expectancy and live healthy and active lives

Recognising the weight of evidence in favour of expanding local HIV testing services, [name] council:

- i. Resolves to:
 - Act to halve the proportion of people diagnosed late with HIV (CD4 count <350mm³) in [local authority area] by 2020.
 - Act to halve the proportion of people living with undiagnosed HIV in [local authority area] by 2020.
- ii. Further resolves to:
 - Ensure that rates of late diagnosed HIV are included as an indicator in its Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA)
 - Ask the Director of Public Health to provide a report outlining what needs to be done locally in commissioning and provision of services in order to halve late diagnosed and undiagnosed HIV by 2020
